## Meet the Ohioana Library

While looking for books in the State Library catalog, you may have noticed that some items have **Ohioana Library** as the location and LIB USE ONLY as the status. So what is the Ohioana Library and why don't their books circulate?



The Ohioana Library, which was established in 1929 by Martha Kinney Cooper, has the **mission of collecting, preserving and promoting the work of Ohio's writers, artists and musicians.** It does this in three ways: maintaining a library collection and reference service, conducting educational outreach, and having public programs.

### Library Collection & Reference Service

The collection, which is housed in a climate-controlled area, is made up of more than 75,000 items, including 45,000 books, 10,000 pieces of sheet music, scrapbooks, pamphlets, Ohio county histories and atlases, original illustrations, and materials pertaining to women's history. Also included are approximately **20,000 biographical files on Ohio writers, musicians, artists, and others of note.**

The material in the library collection **does not circulate**, but all items are available for review by library visitors. Reference requests are accepted via email ([ohioana@ohioana.org](mailto:ohioana@ohioana.org)) and phone (614-466-3831). The library is located in the rear of 274 E. 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue in Columbus, which is the same building that contains the State Library of Ohio and the Kent State Columbus Library Program. Open hours are 9 am to 4:30 pm, Monday through Friday. It is closed on state holidays and on some days around those holidays, so it is always best to call ahead if you want to be sure.

Most of Ohioana's books and some of its sheet music can be found in the State Library's online catalog. However, due to budget cuts and staff shortages, **items received since the fall of 2008 have not been cataloged.**

### Educational Outreach

Established in 1958, **Ohioana Quarterly** is currently published as two double issues annually. It contains reviews of recent books, and articles and essays about the literary and cultural arts in Ohio. It is also the way to get annotated listings of all recent donated books. **Ohioana Quarterly** is distributed to approximately 2,500 members and friends. Beginning in May 2011, **Ohio Magazine** is publishing a special section twice a year devoted to Ohioana, which is also sent to members and friends.

### Public Programs

On **Ohioana Day**, which is celebrated in the fall of each year, Ohioana presents up to six Ohioana Book Awards. In May of each year, the **Ohioana Book Festival** honors up to 100 selected Ohio authors through their attendance at an event open to the public (the next one will be held on May 12, 2012). Other public programs include the annual Cincinnati & Hamilton County Authors event, and the **Ohioana Book Club**, which meets quarterly from 10 am to noon in the Library.
